- We applied for a grant we didn't think we would get and then we got it

What we hope you get out of this:

- Know you aren't alone if you run into roadblocks!
- Things to consider before you apply
- Things that worked for us that may fit into your workflow
- That it doesn't hurt to try!





Why are you here?

So what the heck happened?

- Submitted abstract for special issue of publication
- CARL Practicing Librarian Grant
- Why not try?
- Quickly adapted our abstract into something...
- Declined article abstract for a special issue of a publication
 - ...with an invitation to re-submit for a regular issue
 - FULL OF RELIEF
- Forgot we applied for grant
- Got Grant
- Success!
- Terror

What is our project?

- Curriculum mapping two programs using the ACRL Framework for Information Literacy
- A department at UBCO
- A department at UNBC
 - (our institutions are small)
- Propose an instructional implementation plan at the program level based on the syllabi of courses taught
- Interview faculty to find out their perceptions of this process and plan (this is what the money was for that we got)

Our big mistakes:

- Not reading the instructions thoroughly
- Not proof-reading thoroughly
- Not running this by our supervisors
- Not running this by our research offices
- Not thinking or planning on actually doing the research



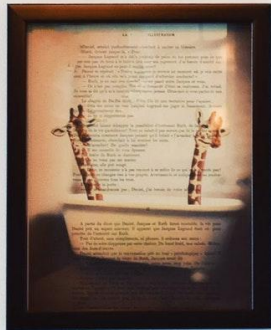
Things we didn't consider before applying (that you should) :

- How grant money actually gets distributed
- Who needs to be informed
- Project planning as part of application
 - Do I actually have time for this?
 - How will this fit into my daily, monthly, yearly workflow?
 - What resources do I need?
 - Who do I need to notify?



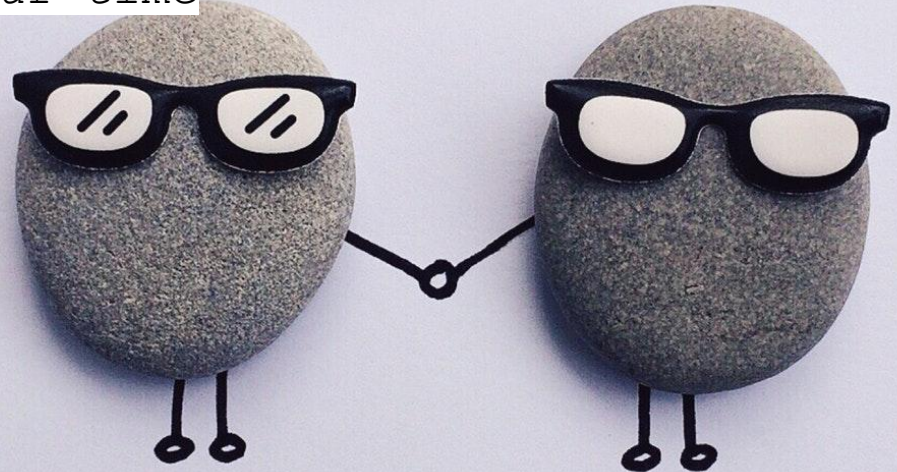
Things we did right
once we got it:

- Pushed for our research to go through the REB.
- Started with a small project.
- Asked for help.



So, what should you do?

- ❑ Pick a project/research that you are genuinely interested in
- ❑ Do some background reading
- ❑ Talk to your supervisor/manager
- ❑ Figure out if you need ethics and plan for the time that takes
- ❑ What resources, besides your time will you need?
 - ❑ Data collection + analysis
- ❑ How will you time-manage?
- ❑ CREATE A PROJECT PLAN
- ❑ Why are you doing this?



Learning from our mistakes:

- I'm here with funding from another grant (from the UNBC Office of Research). What did I do this time?
 - Knew I would definitely be able
 - Completed my application early enough to qualify for pre-review! Our Research Officer found mistakes I had made and steps I had missed (because I didn't know they existed)
- I am in the process of applying for another grant for a practice based project. What did I do this time?
 - Partnered with experienced grant holders
 - Edited, edited, and edited again
 - Had my boss review the application before I submitted
 - Discussed with my supervision and co-applicants project management
 - Created a timeline for project completion that was manageable, with room for changes

Where we are in the project & next steps:

- Got ethics
- Did the mapping
- Created a plan
- Hired a student
- Presented it to faculty
- Sajni + Susie> Done interviews
- Ethics renewal

Next:

- Transcripts
- Data analysis

How this has moved us forward in other areas:

Sajni:

- See ourselves as researchers
- Have the university see us as researchers
- Feeling comfortable with ethics
- Curriculum mapping other programs
- Collaboration

Susie:

- See myself as a researcher
- Feeling comfortable with grant applications processes
- Curriculum mapping other programs
- Collaboration

learn???

- LibParlor...

- Library associations (OLA, CARL)
- Provincial governments
- Institutional grants
- Tri-Agency grants
 - There are tons! Some are for research, but there are also specific grants for travel, events, and outreach initiatives
