




## Background

Economic impact studies are commonly used across many sectors, including culture, parks, sports tourism, & public libraries.

#### 1. Direct Benefits

- Libraries provide services and programs that benefit their communities. By measuring their monetary value against market cost of replacement for comparative services and programs, direct benefits can be captured and expressed.
- 2. Indirect Benefits The Multiplier Effect
- The benefits created by the re-spending of dollars within the local economy. They are generated by direct spending.
- When libraries spend money on operations, capital projects, salaries, and library materials, that money enters the economy and is re-spent.
- We use an economic multiplier range of 1.4 to 2.0 based on multipliers specified by Statistics Canada for relevant industries.








"At its November, 29, 2012 meeting, the Library Board passed a motion to undertake a study of the economic impacts and benefits of Toronto Public Library and the role of public libraries in economic development. At the City Council meeting, January 15-17, 2013 Council passed a motion to request that the Chief Librarian prepare a <u>cost-benefit analysis of the Open Hours Policy</u> and the economic impact of Library services and provide a report to the City Manager for review and report prior to the 2014 budget process."


